





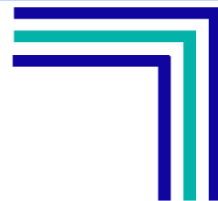
## KEY HIGHLIGHTS OF ANNUAL REPORT

## **❖ STUDENTS' COUNSELING**

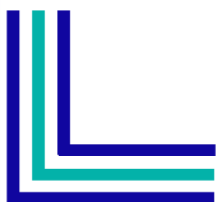

She is a therapist who specialises in Cognitive Behaviour Therapy. She visits the college twice a week to provide counselling to students.

## **❖ ACADEMIC INITIATIVES**

In the even semester, the college organised a Seminar on "How to Effectively Improve IQ and EQ" for all the courses classes taken by Dr. Jaya Mohan, the college's psychologist. Further, the college organised special classes for M.Com. Entrance Examination of the University of Delhi. The college has also been running the Centre for School of Open Learning and organising classes for the B.Com. students of the Academic Year 2017-18.

## **❖ FACULTY DEVELOPMENT & ACHIEVEMENTS**

With more than 90 faculty members consistently involved in academic upgradation, this year around 100 books and articles were either published or presented by the teachers in the journals of International and National repute. The faculty members have been regularly participating in Faculty Development Programmes. Many of them have chaired Panel Discussions, functioned as Judges and Resource Persons in various seminars, workshops and panel discussions organized by various academic institutions and universities. Many of the faculty members are also members of various International and National Associations and Boards.







### ○ **LIBRARY COMMITTEE REPORT**

The College library has been contributing towards the education of the students to the fullest of its potential. A total of 28 periodicals and journals are available in the library. The day-to-day knowledge of the nation and the world can be obtained by the 14 newspapers which are available every day in the college library. A total of 1407 books were added to the library's collection in the session 2018-19.

The library staff is regularly updating their technical skills so as to take the library towards automation in the new digital era. Sh. R.S. Meena, Professional Assistant, attended the five days' workshop for the automation and digitalization organized at the South Campus, University of Delhi. This helped the library to develop a more friendly and amiable attitude towards the students.

The library also provides the facility of National Library & Information Services, Infrastructure for Scholarly content (the N-list website).

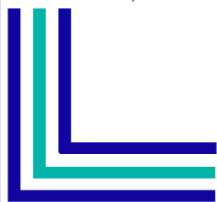
### ○ **ACTIVITIES OF INDIAN LANGUAGES CLUB**

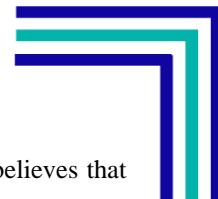
### ○ **ACTIVITIES OF ART AND CULTURE ASSOCIATION**

### ***RISHABH - THE MUSIC SOCIETY***

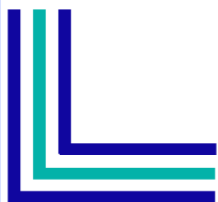

### ***PHULKARI- THE FOLK-DANCE SOCIETY***



### ○ **ACTIVITIES OF F.I.N.A. - Forum for International and National Awareness**

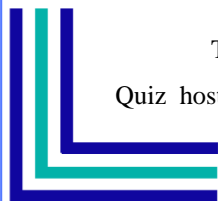

The mega-event hosted around 150 students from various Colleges and Universities across Delhi-NCR for a series of competitions celebrating the freedom of expression and offering a platform for students to showcase their talent in art, academia and extempore.


The ceremony also marked the unveiling of "F.I.N.A. Gazette", the periodic e-video Newsletter which is published fortnightly on the Facebook page of F.I.N.A. The Newsletter voices a multitude of collective discourses thereby fulfilling the objective of the Forum.

The first day of 'FINESSE', October 30, 2018, saw events like Open Mic Competition and Turn Coat Debate Competition. 19 entries were shortlisted for performance in Open Mic, the judges for which were Mr. Allen Charles, Content Writer at Magic Circle Communications, and Dr. SapnaDudeja, Assistant Professor, DyalSingh Evening College. The collection of around 700 items was distributed to the underprivileged kids in a slum area near Laxmi Nagar.






### ○ **N.S.S. –NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME ACTIVITES**

Our Principal Dr. Pawan Kumar Sharma gave a unique piece of information to the audience that University of Delhi has a historical relationship with Shaheed Bhagat Singh as he was kept as a prisoner in the basement of North Campus which is now the Vice Chancellor's office. Sh. Yadvinder Singh Sandhu expressed his unhappiness that unfortunately we have forgotten our freedom fighters who lost their lives for the sake of country. He pointed out that we are responsible for this because we did not educate our young generation about the freedom fighters. He informed the youngsters that he has established Bhagat Singh Brigade to propagate the sacrifices and contribution of our national heroes. He also made an appeal that all the people including youngsters should participate in this movement.

### ○ **PLACEMENT CELL ACTIVITIES**

The Placement Cell, Dyal Singh Evening College, has been highly active throughout the year, contributing towards the overall training and development of the students in the college. The marvelous team has grabbed every opportunity for students to get placed in the market. After taking charge on August 17, 2018, the Placement Cell immediately activated itself and achieved the following:

- CL Educate Counseling Session on January 23, 2019, was conducted for CAT aspiring students. Followed by a CL Educate Seminar: “Choosing between the right exam- CATvs GMATvs GRE& Decoding CAT” on January 25, 2019.
- Pooled Placement Drives have also been made possible because of our successful collaborations with other colleges, Dreamz Pooled Placement and British Telecom were amongst the very successful ones.
- An Inter-College and Inter-University, Internship Fair 2.0 - "Endeavouring Careers" was conducted on February 21, 2019 by the Placement Cell, which saw a footfall of 250+ students with 800+ interviews conducted and with 190+ internships offered. The Fair had 24 companies as recruiters, namely LIC, Bennett, Coleman & Co. Ltd., Sharekhan, IBM Oracle- KVCH among others.
- An Off-Campus Placement Drive was conducted by one of the Big Fours, EY-GDS, on March 30, 2019 at their Gurgaon office.

The Placement Cell has triumphantly boosted the career opportunities of students in the college and this was possible only under the kind guidance of the Convenor, Mrs. Archana Anand, teacher members, Dr. Sumita Puri, Dr. Surya Bhushan, Ms. Neha Birwal and Mr. Sushil Kumar. Also, the student body, a team consisting of 34 members, has worked hard to complete the objectives of the Cell.

The Placement Cell envisions giving students a platform to access the best opportunities in their way. The Cell is equally determined to develop the employable nature of the students.

### ○ **ATIVITIES OF COMHUB - THE COMMERCE SOCIETY**

During the academic session 2018-19, the Commerce Society of the college, COMHUB conducted more than twenty programmes involving participation of large number of students not only from our college but also students from other Colleges and Universities.

The first seminar of the year 2018-19 was about ‘How to Prepare for Civil Services’ in collaboration with GS Mentors on August 21, 2018. It was addressed by Mr. Sohail, IPS Officer. The seminar was attended by more than 200 students and it proved immensely beneficial for our students in motivating their interest towards Civil Services.





On September 20, 2018, the society conducted a seminar on 'How to crack GD and PI.' It was successfully organized in collaboration with JIMS, Kalkaji. It provided information about an actual GD scenario along with useful tips followed by the students at the end of the event.




#### ○ **ACTIVITIES OF RAJNEETI VIGYAN PARISHAD**
